The calendar is now regularly updated so if you cannot remember when an event is happening, or where, just click on that event and read on.

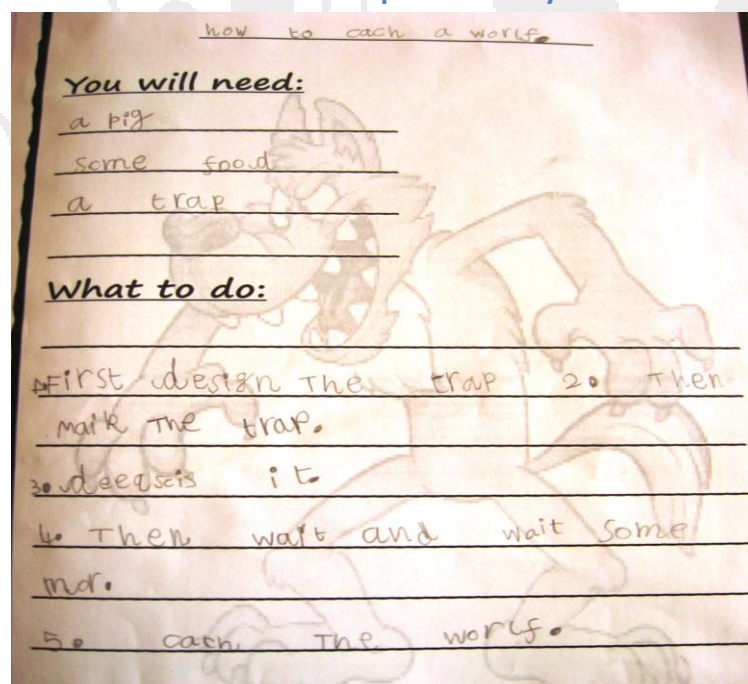

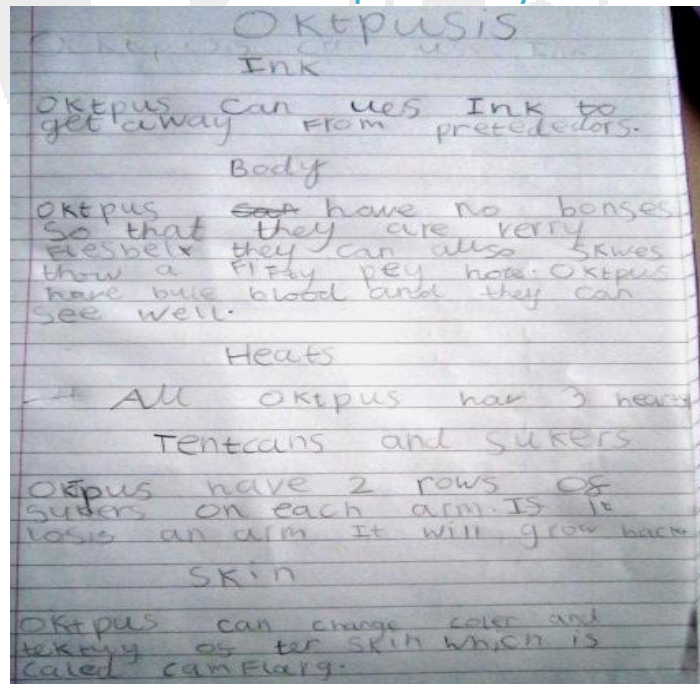
Under Curriculum, you will find a Termly overview that shows in more detail what the children in Year 1 and Year 2 are learning each term and the interesting activities they will be participating in.
