#### May Fayre

#### School Census 15th May

We would be grateful for as many parents who are eligible for universal free school lunches (Hedgehogs and Squirrels) to order school lunches, for the 15<sup>th</sup> May. This ensures that the school receive the funding required to subsidise the lunches, in the following year. If your child doesn't usually have a packed lunch it would be a good time to try one. Nothing will get wasted!

#### Farm visit

Whaddon School have been invited to visit a working farm, on 21<sup>st</sup> May. This visit will enable children to experience first-hand, the journey of wool from lamb, to sheep, to fleece, to crafting projects. Alongside this, there will be the opportunity to feed the lambs, observe the cows and calves and experience a tractor trailer ride.

In order to help us ensure all paperwork is in order, ahead of the visit, please can parents complete the consent and medical forms issued via ParentMail by Mrs Ellis returning them to school no later than the **9<sup>th</sup> May.** Payments should be made in the usual way, via ParentMail. #### VE day 80<sup>th</sup> celebration

On Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> May, Whaddon School will be commemorating VE day, which heralded the wonderful news that the war in Europe had ended, 80 years ago. We are marking the occasion with a range of activities related to life in Wartime Britain, music, recipes and the impact of rationing. We will be visiting the memorial at Jubilee Hall, to remember those who fought for our freedom. Lunch will be a special occasion, in the form of a street party layout, in the hall. Hot lunches and packed lunches are fine, so there are no preparations required. If you wanted to enter into the spirit, then please provide your child with a celebratory packed lunch. Unfortunately, items must not be shared, due to allergies and intolerances, individual small cakes/cake bars are permitted, for this special occasion, but are optional.
