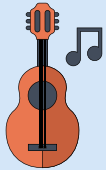
The definite article - 'The'

The word for 'the' in French is different depending on the gender of the noun:

- A masculine noun uses **le**.
- A feminine noun uses **la**.
- A noun beginning with a vowel or an h takes **l'**.
- Plural nouns take **les**.



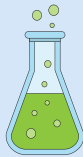

The indefinite article - 'A/an/some'

The word for 'a/an' in French changes depending on the gender of the noun:

- A masculine noun uses **un**.
- A feminine noun uses **une**.
- Plural nouns take **des**.
