
Squirrel Class Weekly Updates


Language and Literacy

A range of characters, settings and journeys were represented in some exciting stories. We complete work on this book by wondering what else the sea might see then we created drawings and short written pieces to show our ideas of the weather in different scenes with a variety of objects. Great imagination and vocabulary were used!



Maths

Year 1 have been learning to Tell the Time, starting with naming and ordering Days of the Week and Months of the Year. Then they learnt to read and make o'clock and half-past times on clock faces including having fun making their own cardboard clocks. Year 2 have started a unit on Data Handling, learning how to read and interpret information on Tally Charts, Block Diagraphs and Pictograms. They collected data and made some charts of their own.



Science

We are enjoying our topic on Animals. This week we after recalling the different classification groups, we worked on sorting animals by what they eat: herbivores, carnivores and omnivores. We also had to discuss the statements and decide whether they were true or false and give our reasons for our choice.





History

We continued thinking about Holidays in the Past. This week we have thought about what evidence we could find or collect to investigate the topic further.
