Forest School is on Friday mornings for Squirrel Class.



Language and Literacy


We continued working on Leo and the Octopus by Isabelle Marinov. The story ends with the main character finding that he has lots in common with an octopus called Maya who he meets in an aquarium, he then makes a human friend with similar interests. We also found ourselves fascinated by these unusual sea creatures and began by writing lists of questions in pairs. From this we used the information book Obsessive About Octopuses to find facts and then wrote our own non-fiction leaflets and booklets providing answers to questions.





Maths

Year 2 learnt more about Fractions by finding counting in halves, quarters and thirds of shapes and finding out what equivalent amounts/fractions are. Year 1 have been finding out how to divide numbers of objects by grouping and sharing; Mrs Marchant has been very pleased with their work! There is an opportunity to practise this in the weekly homework.



Science

We completed our topic on Plants by investigating edible plants. We observed a range of fruit and vegetables and identified which parts are edible: root, stem, leaves, fruit or seeds. Then we recorded this by Year 1 sorting pictures and Year 2 creating a labelled diagram. Throughout the topic we have also been making daily observations to see how our Seed Experiment is progressing. We have discovered all of the group's beans that were watered regularly have shown signs of growth (split seeds and shoots) and the ones without water have not changed at all.





Art

We spent two afternoons exploring techniques in Paper Sculpture. Firstly, we learnt how to create different shapes and effects by rolling, twisting and folding paper pieces that we attached to a base piece of card. Then we looked at pieces of art on the theme of The Tree of Life which appear in many holy books and places. After making design sketches, we then shaped, arranged and fixed coloured paper and card together to make our own 3D Tree of Life Paper Sculptures – they look amazing on display in our classroom!
