Language and Literacy

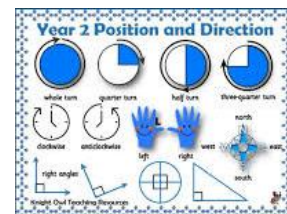


We continued reading Ocean Meets Sky by The Fan Brothers. We reached the end of the book which concludes Finn's imaginary journey, arriving at a magical place and hearing his Grandpa's voice. We then had some fun pretending to go on a class adventure, setting off with Captain Rudiger, through a storm and spotting incredible sights on the way. Stopping just before going ashore, the children went on to draw and write their ideas for their own imaginary sea journeys.



Maths

Year 1 have been handling coins and have begun to understand the amount each one is worth (coin value). They counted the coins using skills of addition and counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Year 2 have been working through a short unit on Position and Direction; they have used directional vocabulary such as forward, back, left and right to follow/give instructions – then moved on to describing the types of turn used – whole/half/quarter turns clockwise and anti-clockwise.



Science

We had an incredible day at the Cotswold Wildlife Park, getting up close to some of the animals we have encountered during our learning about global habitats and animal classification. The children learnt more by listening to the Park Staff explain about how animals are adapted to their habitats. Ask Year 2 about rhino horns and skin and Year 1 about giraffe leg bones and rhino poo... they have so many new animal facts to share!



History

Having decided that we could interview people to learn about the Holidays they went on as children and written our own questions, there is now the opportunity to for them to ask older family members about this subject – so please do the home learning if you can.



Geography

We are linking our Science learning about Animal Habitats and our Literacy/Science about Ocean Life to our Geography. We looked at a map of the world and learnt the names of the Oceans, then labelled them on our own maps. We then looked at photos showing animals in these different places and locating them on the maps.
