# Uniform and forest school equipment

We are spending time relocating clothing with the owner. Please ensure your child has their name on water bottles and book bags and in jumpers, cardigans and coats. All forest school equipment needs to be named and kept in school- including wellies.

Without the correct forest school clothing, your child will **NOT** be able to participate in forest school.

Please ensure hair accessories are school appropriate and that long hair is tied back.

## **Reading records**



Whilst reading with your child, there are questions you can ask in order to help them retrieve information and discuss the plot and characters. Reading is really important for all of our pupils and enables access to all areas of learning. We ask that you, or someone in the household aims to read with your child, at least 5 times a week. They will also be

read with in school.

For older pupils, having someone listen to them read or taking turns to read pages helps them hear words read aloud and enhances their prosody (expression and intonation).

The reading records need to be completed and brought into school **every day**, so that when we hear readers, in school, we know what they have been doing at home and we can record when we have heard your child read.

For younger readers, a book matching their phonic level will be given to them to practice reading. A book for pleasure will be kept at school. Comprehension is as important as decoding, so please do ask your child questions, as you go through the book. Our Little Wandle Letters and Sounds scheme has specific guidelines about how frequently these books are to be changed. This is to aid fluency and build up vocabulary and expression.

## Break time snacks for Key Stage 2

We have had some hungry Badgers, at break time this week. Please can parents of children in Badgers and Foxes class provide fruit snacks, or healthy equivalent, for their child's morning break. Only children in Key Stage 1 are eligible for the free fruit for schools programme.

# **Open mornings**

We are holding a range of open mornings for parents of children who will be school age in September 2026. The dates are on the banner on the school gate and can be found on the school website. Please share this with anyone you know is looking for a school place for their child. If the dates and times are not convenient, we can arrange a separate viewing. The appointments will be 5 minutes and will be to discuss how your child has settled and next steps which can be supported at home. Should you wish to discuss any SEN matters or require a slightly longer appointment, please let the school office know. Maximum time will be 10 minutes.
