

Forest School News

Winter is creeping towards us and we've had some chilly noses at Forest School! Attending a weekly Forest School session is a great way for children to notice changes in the seasons, both large and small.

The children from Class 1 have been role playing over the past two weeks. The general theme is Dungeons and Dragons which has created opportunities to discuss the differences between the past and present.

Some of the Class 1 children have been very creative recently; they've been decorating leaves and stones, making stick dolls and creating Forest School books. Naturally, they used charcoal from the previous week's fire to draw and write in their books.!

Class 2 has also been creative. Their projects include pen holders and pens, using tools such as pen knives to whittle wood. Some of the children also decorated autumn leaves with glitter to make a collage. They went on to create a picture frame for their collage, using sticks they had gathered. .






$4 \times 8 = 32$. There are 32 cookies in all.
