# **Reading records**



We have issued all children with their new reading records. Inside the front cover there are tips on how to improve your child's comprehension, whilst reading with them and questions you can ask to help them retrieve information and discuss the plot and characters. Reading is really important for all of our pupils and enables access to

all areas of learning. We ask that you, or someone in the household aims to read with your child, at least 5 times a week. They will also be read with in school.

For older pupils, having someone listen to them read or taking turns to read pages helps them hear words read aloud and enhances their prosody (expression and intonation).

The reading records need to be completed and brought into school **every day**, so that when we hear readers, in school, we know what they have been doing at home and we can record when we have heard your child read.

For younger readers, a book matching their phonic level will be given to them to practice reading. A book for pleasure will be kept at school. Comprehension is as important as decoding, so please do ask your child questions, as you go through the book.

#### Lunches

Please ensure you have booked your child's school lunches on wise pay. If you have missed the deadline to book school lunches, please provide your child with a packed lunch, until you can book school lunches.

# Break time snacks for Key Stage 2

Please can parents of children in Badgers and Foxes class provide fruit snacks, or healthy equivalent, for their child's morning break. Only children in Key Stage 1 are eligible for the free fruit for schools programme.

### **Open mornings**
